



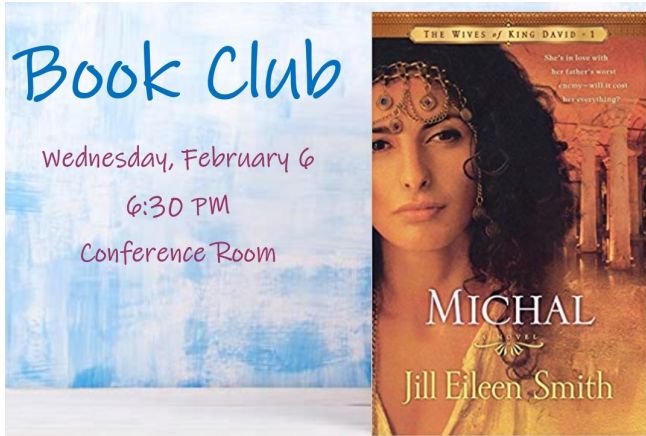

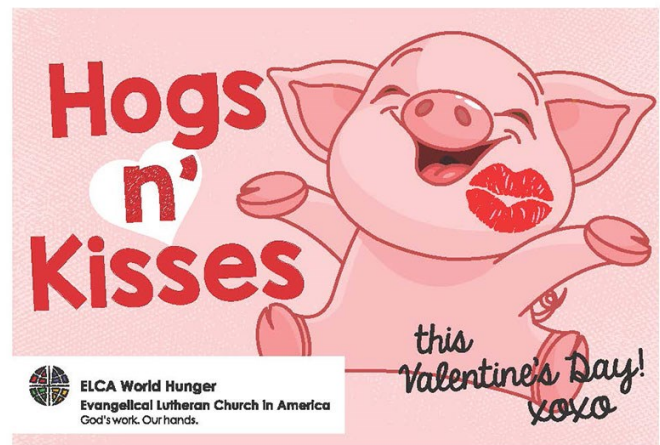

### Different Worship Experiences And Still One Church

The Saturday worship service was created many years ago to respond to the needs and visions of people who were not filled spiritually by the Sunday morning experience. At first, the vision was to create a contemporary worship experience with a band and more upbeat music. However, this did not serve the needs of the people. God was calling them in another direction and through much prayer and conversation, the Saturday Worship Team moved in the direction of a contemplative worship experience. Contemplative means creating intentional time for silent reflection, meaningful prayer, and engagement with scripture. The music is very simple, often utilizing Taize music. This is repetitive prayer set to simple musical lines that is sung over and over until the prayer moves from our minds to our hearts. *Oh Lord Hear My Prayer* and *Take Oh Take Me As I Am* are examples of a Taize songs.

The Sunday worship service's focus is creating a blended service incorporating both traditional and more contemporary components. It is a liturgical service that intentionally includes all ages, especially children. The music is more advanced and includes many genres like traditional, classical, and contemporary Christian.

Both services are centered on God and God's word with all components pointing to the scripture and Jesus Christ. Both services incorporate liturgical art into the worship experience and have very similar bulletins and order of worship.

We have two different worship experiences, but are one church with one focus, and that is Jesus Christ. It's tempting to think, with two different worship experiences we are a divided church and that is true if we are not "united in the same mind and same purpose" (1 Corinthians 1:10) according to the Apostle Paul. And that same mind and purpose is God's mind and purpose. If we, as St. Paul's Lutheran Church, listen to God and follow God's purpose for us, we are one church. We have different ways to worship the same God that we all follow. We rejoice in our differences and move in one direction as the church of Jesus Christ.—*Pastor Sami*

## How's Your New Year's Resolution Coming?

A month has gone by since you made your resolution. How's it going? Going great? Come and gone? Struggling to stay on track? What resolution?

Many people struggle with their resolutions because their resolutions aren't SMART: Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, and Timely. Instead of "I resolve to lose weight", try "I resolve to lose at least three pounds by the end of this month." And then consider what you need to do to reach the goal.

As you consider the steps needed to reach your goal, try taking small steps. Small steps keep your resolution from becoming overwhelming or too hard. When you set out to do something easy, you are more likely to succeed. And success motivates you to take the next step towards your goal.

For example, one step towards losing 3lbs by the end of the month could be eating another serving of vegetables each day. Make it easy: snacking on carrots and hummus, adding a handful of spinach to your bowl of soup or pasta, or filling a wrap with bagged salad.

A side note, eating another serving of veggies each day is a great resolution all by itself. Many of us don't get the USDA's recommended three servings of vegetables a day. Veggies provide so many good things...water, fiber, thousands of disease-preventing phytonutrients, as well as vitamins, and minerals. How can you not be practically giddy admiring (and eating) the bright, inviting colors of a plate of veggies?!

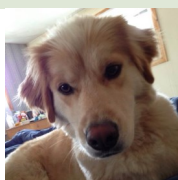
### Meet Heather McLaughlin & her husband, Mike.

## Stephen Ministries

### Receptivity to Care

Most people are much more open to giving care than to receiving it. When a person is giving care, he or she is in a position of strength, stability, and authority. When a person is receiving care, he or she is acknowledging weakness, insecurity, and vulnerability.

As a result, there are countless people today who, though they could really benefit from a Christian friend who would listen and care for them, instead tough it out on their own. They remain the strong silent type, or wear a smile across a face that is holding back a flood of tears. Society encourages this (particularly for men). To ask for help is to admit weakness. To show weakness is to admit inferiority.

**But God did not create us to be independent. We were created to be interdependent. God's Word is clear on this all the way back to Genesis: "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him" (Genesis 2:18). The New Testament underscores this theme with more than 50 verses that contain the words "one another," "encourage one another," "build up one another," and "pray for one another."**

What these verses don't say is that we alone are to love, encourage, build up, and pray for other people. The "one another" wording gives them a reciprocal meaning. It also tells us that we are to allow other people to love, encourage, build up and pray for us!



It is most difficult for people to ask for help. Whether it is because of guilt, shame, inadequacy, or fear of rejection, many would much prefer to suffer alone than ask for help.

**But suffering alone is not God's intent for us. Jesus promises, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). We can receive this promised rest when we turn to one another for comfort and help.**

Our Stephen Ministers know all about receiving care. Many of them have been on the receiving end of care at an earlier point in their lives—something that has motivated them to give care now. They know how difficult it is to ask for help, but they also know the great personal and spiritual growth and healing that follow. They know how to respond in a loving, caring, and nonjudgmental manner. They are equipped, ready, and waiting to provide the comfort and care God very much desires you to have.

If you find yourself now or in the future facing difficulties in life, don't succumb to society's norm of remaining strong and suffering alone. Take the courageous step of seeking help. Open your heart to receiving God's love and grace through another person. Our Stephen Ministry offers the opportunity for a very confidential relationship with someone who will listen to you and provide you with the care and encouragement you need, while Christ works inside to bring rest to your weary, burdened heart.
