I Believe...

Lent begins March 6 on Ash Wednesday. During this season, we journey with Jesus to the cross and his death. We hear how corrupt and unjust the powerful were who sentenced Jesus to death. We watch as Jesus' friends and disciples betray and deny him. We feel Jesus' loneliness. We reflect on our sins and how we have fallen short of God's expectations of us. But within this story of pain, sin, and sorrow, when God seems silent and removed, we still believe. We believe in God, even when God is silent. This is the focus this year, for Lent, to help us engage the season more deeply; I Believe... It is inspired by a poem written by a Jewish person in the cellar of a concentration camp in Cologne.

"I believe in the sun
 even when it is not shining
 And I believe in love,
 even when there's no one there.
 And I believe in God,
 even when he is silent.

I believe through any trial,
 there is always a way
 But sometimes in this suffering
 and hopeless despair
 My heart cries for shelter,
 to know someone's there
 But a voice rises within me, saying
 hold on
 my child, I'll give you strength,
 I'll give you hope. Just stay a little
 while.

I believe in the sun
 even when it is not shining
 And I believe in love
 even when there's no one there
 But I believe in God
 even when he is silent
 I believe through any trial

Epiphany Artwork

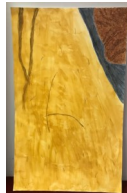
Four people from St. Paul's have created one piece of art in four sections. These artists used their unique gifts to create their piece of art that, when put them together, reveals God's larger picture for us. Each artist could use whatever medium they felt the Spirit calling them to use. After, they wrote an explanation of how God inspired them to create their art piece.

"As I stared at the blank canvas, I felt a divine nudge to create this art piece with a collection of fabrics, natural fibers, and found items. The resulting piece is eclectic and diverse, with many varied patterns and textures. Antique crocheted pink and cream-colored lace made by my grandmother forms one of the lines and the blue area is needle felted silk fibers on denim to resemble a sunset. The purple stripe and the sun are portions of knitted objects. Look closely for one area of three purple gems in a line, representing the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God clearly worked as the architect in this design. I hope it speaks to you in some way!" ~Ellen Cooper

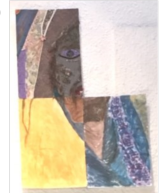

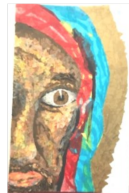

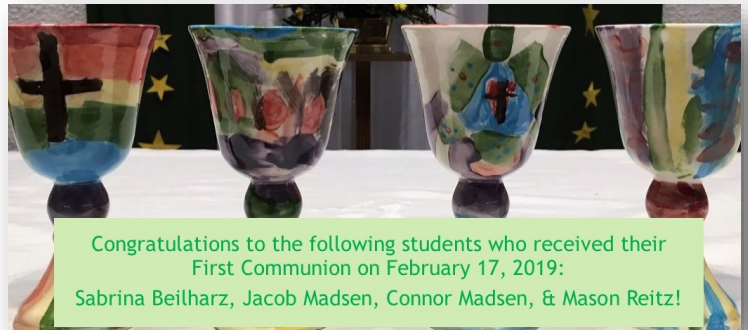
